WHEREAS, the County Council intends by this ordinance to increase from 25 to 70 the aggregate maximum number of additional 2021 county FTEs the County Council may approve pursuant to Section 7 of Amended Ordinance No. 20-075; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance does not appropriate funds for the additional FTEs provided for herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED:

Section 1. Section 7 of Amended Ordinance No. 20-075 is amended to read:

Section 7. Additional FTEs. Notwithstanding the limitations contained in Sections 5 and 6, the Council may authorize one or more increases in the maximum number of FTEs for a specific department or fund, up to an aggregate of ((25))70 additional FTEs for the County for 2021, upon finding that (a) the increase is in the best interests of the County and (b) necessary funds have been appropriated. Council action to increase the maximum number of FTEs is an administrative act and may be taken by motion.

At the hearing, Council may consider alternatives/amendments to the proposed ordinance.




