<u>Subject:</u> Interlocal Agreement with the Town of Darrington for Broadband

Outreach.

Scope: Snohomish County and the Town of Darrington wish to enter into an

Agreement to set forth the mutual obligations, responsibilities, and rights of the County and the Town as they relate to the Town's provision of Outreach services pertaining to the opportunity to obtain broadband connections prior to the completion of SR 530 and Verlot broadband

construction.

<u>Authority Granted:</u> Snohomish County Council approves the County's participation with the Town of Darrington in a Broadband Outreach Project to inform individuals and business owners about the opportunity to obtain connections prior to the completion of construction in the vicinity of SR 530 and Verlot and authorizes the Executive to sign the interlocal agreement with the Town of Darrington, under SCC 2.48.165(2).

<u>Background:</u> Ensuring access to broadband services for all communities throughout Snohomish County is an important public policy objective of the County. In July 2021, the Washington State Department of Commerce awarded a grant to Snohomish County for Broadband Expansion along SR 530. In July 2023, Snohomish County Council approved the Broadband Spending Plan (<u>Motion 23-309</u>) that allocated ARPA grant funding for Broadband Expansion. This expansion is vital to connecting individuals and businesses to educational opportunities, heath care services, economic development, emergency preparedness, and other essential services.

Snohomish County and the Town of Darrington want to ensure that individuals and business owners know about the opportunity to obtain connections prior to the completion of the construction. The County has requested that the Town of Darrington conduct outreach to ensure that impacted individuals and businesses are able to connect to broadband services prior to completion of construction.
