Thank you for your interest in serving on the Snohomish County Agricultural Advisory Board. The Snohomish County Agricultural Advisory Board is seeking volunteers to fulfill 6 upcoming vacancies to commence in April 2018. The application process will close on December 15th and you will receive a communication at that point with next steps.

The Board advises and makes recommendations directly to the county council, county executive, the department of planning and development services, the public works department, and the department of finance. Early participation in the legislative process is an important function of the Board.

The Board serves in an advisory role on rural and agricultural policies, development regulations and other matters of related to agriculture which from time to time may be referred to the Board by the county council or county executive, or as may be raised by the Board.

Members must reside in Snohomish County, be engaged in commercial agricultural activities within Snohomish County, and fulfill the requirements of the specific position to which they are appointed. Members do not represent council districts. Snohomish County Charter Section 2.20 authorizes the County Council to confirm members of the Board nominated by the County Executive. Each Term is for 2 or 4 years. The Board currently meets on the second Tuesday of each month from 12:30pm – 2:30pm.
