NOTICE OF ENACTMENT

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on July 28, 2021, the Snohomish County Council adopted Emergency Ordinance 21-047, which shall be effective immediately.

EMERGENCY ORDINANCE NO. 21-047
RELATED TO THE 2021 BUDGET; MAKING A
SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION IN FUND 130 TO
PROVIDE EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY FOR AMERICAN
RESCUE PLAN ACT FUNDS

WHEREAS, on January 21, 2020, the Washington State Department of Health confirmed the first reported case of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) in the United States in Snohomish County, Washington. COVID-19, a respiratory disease that can result in serious illness or death, is caused by the SARS-CoV-2 virus, which is a new strain of coronavirus that had not been previously identified in humans and can easily spread from person to person.

WHEREAS, since January 21, 2020, the disease has spread throughout the United States. On January 31, 2020, the United States Department of Health and Human Services secretary Alex Azar declared a public health emergency for COVID-19, beginning January 27, 2020. On February 29, 2020, Washington State Governor Jay Inslee proclaimed a public health emergency for COVID-19. On March 4, 2020, the Snohomish County Health Officer proclaimed a countywide public health emergency for COVID-19. On March 4, 2020, Executive Dave Somers issued a "Local Proclamation of Emergency Snohomish County" for COVID-19 (the "Emergency"). On March 13, 2020, the President of the United States of America declared COVID-19 a National Emergency.

WHEREAS, in response to the public health emergency and its negative economic impacts, Snohomish County has been funding additional services and programs, such as 2-1-1 enhancement, childcare for essential workers, and food security.

WHEREAS, additional resources are required to continue these services and programs;

WHEREAS, on March 10, 2021, the United States Congress passed the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 ("ARPA").

WHEREAS, Section 9901 of ARPA created a Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund and a Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund; and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Treasury provided direct relief to units of local government through the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds ("CLFR"); and

WHEREAS, Snohomish County has received CLFR funds from the United States Department of Treasury.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED

Section 1. The County Council makes the following findings of fact: a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$13,100,000.00 is necessary in Fund 130, for budget year 2021, to provide expenditure authority for costs related to the public health emergency and its negative economic impacts.

Section 2. The appropriation unit and allocation detail for the supplemental appropriation described in Section 1 are as follows:

Section 3. The County Council further finds that there is a need

for such supplemental appropriation because the funds that support it were unanticipated at the time of adoption of the 2021 budget and have not been previously appropriated.

Section 4. The County Council further finds as a fact that this ordinance is necessary for public health and safety. Based on the foregoing, the County Council declares that an emergency exists and that this ordinance shall take effect immediately.
