**Subject:** Agreement CC01-24 with Graymar Environmental Services, Inc. for Spill Response at Public Works and Operated Facilities.

**Scope:** The proposed agreement is for quick and effective response to hazardous materials spills or dumping, including access to emergency and routine spill response services. Public Works manages 1650 miles of public right-of-way, over a dozen buildings, operates solid waste facilities, storage areas, and is custodian of various vacant properties', on all of which hazardous materials can be dumped or mismanaged and/or spills can happen.

**Authority Granted:** Approve and authorize the County Executive to sign the Professional Services Agreement CC01-24 with Graymar Environmental Services, Inc. for a total amount not to exceed \$150,000, under SCC 3.04.140(8).

**Background:** The Public Works Department solicited the services of a contractor to assist with Spill Response at Public Works Managed and Operated Facilities through RFP-23-057. Graymar Environmental Services, Inc. was one of two firms to respond to the Request For Proposals, and was selected though established Federal, State and County policies and practices. The Professional Services Agreement was negotiated, and the total budget is \$150,000.
