

**Timing Options for Motions with Council Initiatives Relative to Docket XXI Actions**  
**Supplement to Staff Report Regarding Proposed Motions 22-090, -092, -095, -096, -097, -098, and -099**  
**March 1, 2022, Planning and Community Development Committee**

**1. Expedite**

March 1—Discussion of Motions in Planning and Community Development Committee

March 2—9:00 Consideration of Motions in General Legislative Session

March 2—10:30 Continued Hearing on Docket XXI, including final action

Pros: Decisions on motions that overlap with docket applications complete before end of docket hearing

Cons: No time to discuss or revise motions if desired, input from docket hearing not reflected in motions that might combine docket applications into one council-initiated plan amendment

**2. Typical Timing**

March 1—Discussion of Motions in Planning and Community Development Committee

March 2—Continued Hearing on Docket XXI, including final action

March 9—Consideration of Motions in General Legislative Session

Pros: Docket decisions will be known

Cons: Little time to revise motions in response to docket actions or for other reasons,

**3. Continue Discussion of Motions**

March 1—Discussion of Motions in Planning and Community Development Committee

March 2—Continued Hearing on Docket XXI, including final action

March 15—Continued Discussion of Motions in Planning and Community Development Committee

March 16 or 23—Consideration of Motions in General Legislative Session

Pros: Docket decisions will be known

Cons: Provides time to discuss and revise motions in response to docket actions or for other reasons

**4. Continue Discussion of Motions and Continue Docket Hearing**

March 1—Discussion of Motions in Planning and Community Development Committee

March 2—Continued Hearing on Docket XXI, continue again until after action on Motions

March 15—Continued Discussion of Motions in Planning and Community Development Committee

March 16 or 23—Consideration of Motions in General Legislative Session at 9:00

March 16 or 23—Conclude Docket Hearing at 10:30

Pros: Decisions on motions affecting docket applications will be known before final docket actions

Cons: Longer process may be confusing to public
