Subject: Lynnwood Behavioral Health Facility

Scope: Snohomish County is seeking to enter into an interlocal agreement with the City of Lynnwood. Snohomish County will provide \$3,000,000 of Chemical Dependency/Mental Health Funds for the creation of a behavioral facility at 19321 44th Avenue West, Lynnwood, WA 90036 called the [Lynnwood Community Recovery Center](#).

The facility will serve up to 32 individuals at one time and clients will be adults ages 18 and older who are in crisis. There will be units for short term stays (up to 24 hours) and long term stays (up to 7 days). Services will be available to Snohomish County residents on the same terms as those for residents in the City of Lynnwood.

The City of Lynnwood agrees to:

- Construct a three-story building in the Northeast corner of the property that the City will operate as a licensed residential treatment facility; and
- Complete construction by December 31, 2024.

Duration: Upon execution until December 31, 2029. Activities described in the Agreement that are performed on or after November 18, 2021, shall be governed by the terms of the Agreement.
