Nicole Gorle, Sr. Legislative Analyst, explained that District Court has been awarded \$29,200.00 in additional funds from the Administrative Office of the Courts for audio and visual upgrades, interpreter services, and mental health programs. She explained that this ordinance would approve a supplemental appropriation in the District Court's Budget increasing their revenue and expenditure by that associated amount.

ACTION: Vice-Chair Nehring made a motion to set time and date for a public hearing for July 5, 2023, at the hour of 10:30 a.m. Councilmember Peterson seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

b. Ordinance 23-060, relating to the 2023 Budget; making an emergency appropriation in Special Revenue Fund 100 to provide additional expenditure authority for emergent courthouse technology upgrades and improvements

Nicole Gorle, Sr. Legislative Analyst, provided a staff report. She said this ordinance would approve an emergency appropriation in District Court's 2023 Budget, increasing appropriation authority by \$552,776.00. She said funding will be used to supplement audio and visual upgrades to all courtrooms and purchasing a document management system.

ACTION: Vice-Chair Nehring made a motion to set time and date for a public hearing for July 5, 2023, at the hour of 10:30 a.m. Councilmember Peterson seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.
