Subject: Office of Public Defense – Interagency Agreement between State and

County

Scope: This motion would approve an interagency agreement between the

County and the Washington State Office of Public Defense under which the State OPD agrees to provide partial or full reimbursement for expenses for assignment of dependency cases in Snohomish County, contingent on available funding. The County must apply for

reimbursement by June 1st of each fiscal year.

<u>Authority Granted:</u> Authorizes the Executive to execute the agreement.

Background: The Sixth Amendment of the United States Constitution states that the accused has the right to the assistance of counsel for their defense in criminal prosecutions. As not every defendant can afford an attorney, in 1989 Washington State implemented Chapter 409 (RCW 10.101) stating that "legal representation should be provided for indigent persons and persons who are indigent and able to contribute." This chapter also requires counties and cities to establish standards for the delivery of defense services to indigent defendants. Part of the County's current role is the assignment of cases to lawyers which is handled by two attorneys in the County's OPD.
