Background:

In 2007 the Washington State Legislature passed <u>HB 1001</u>, making many changes to state law regarding auto theft. Among the many changes, the bill established grants to local government for auto theft prevention and the Washington Auto Theft Prevention Authority (<u>WATPA</u>) to assist local governments in addressing auto theft.

In 2008 the County received its first grant through WATPA of \$827,185 for the contract period of one year and the Snohomish County established the Snohomish County Auto Theft Task Force (SNOCAT). The mission of SNOCAT is to reduce vehicle theft in the County "through pro-active enforcement efforts, apprehension of criminals who steal vehicles, and increasing public awareness of and education about auto theft." SNOCAT is comprised of detectives from Marysville Police Department, Snohomish County Sheriff's Office, the Washington State Patrol, and a prosecutor from the Snohomish County Prosecutor's Office.

During the 2025-2026 Budget process, the 2025 Grant Work Plan (GWP) for the Sheriff's Office was approved through Motion 24-381. Page 7 of the Sheriff's Office GWP included a grant for the Auto Theft Task Force in the amount of \$830,000.
