## Consideration

The Executive's Office requests Council consider approving proposed Motion 22-070 which would approve and authorize an agreement with the Washington State Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS) Money Follows the Person (MFP) Grant.

## **Background**

The Money Follows the Person Medicaid demonstration project supports state efforts for rebalancing their long-term care services and supports system so that individuals have a choice of where they live and receive services.<sup>1</sup>

The goals of the program are:

- Increase the use of home and community-based services (HCBS) and reduce the use of institutionally based services
- Eliminate barriers in state law, state Medicaid plans, and state budgets that restrict
  the use of Medicaid funds to enable Medicaid-eligible individuals to receive support
  for appropriate and necessary long-term services and supports in the settings of
  their choice
- Strengthen the ability of Medicaid programs to provide HCBS to people who choose to transition out of institutions
- Put procedures in place to provide quality assurance and improve HCBS

## **Current Proposal**

*Scope:* Motion 22-070 approves an agreement with DSHS for Snohomish County to partner with local hospitals to implement the MFP demonstration program.

Duration: July 1, 2021 through December 31, 2023

Fiscal Implications: \$195,000

**<u>2022 Budget:</u>** This was not included in the 2022 Grant Work Plan – no match required.

Appropriation exists in Dept. 20 – Pending Grants.

2021 - NTE \$39,000; 2022 - NTE \$78,000
