<u>Duration:</u> The previous ILA expired on August 25, 2017. The proposed new agreement will take effect upon mutual execution and shall remain in effect for an initial six (6) years, or if amended as per the agreement. The Agreement maybe extended or renewed for up to two (2) additional six (6) year terms.

<u>Authority Granted:</u> Approve and authorize the Snohomish County Executive, or designee, to sign the Interlocal Agreement between Snohomish County and the City of Stanwood for Traffic Control Device and Street Light Maintenance, under SCC 3.04.140(1) and 13.01.020(5).

Background: Snohomish County and the city of Stanwood have previously entered into a Signal Maintenance Interlocal Agreement. The first was approved on November 17, 1999, which expired on November 15, 2013. The most recent Agreement with the city of Stanwood was approved on August 25, 2017 (Ordinance 17-044), expiring August 24, 2023.

The city and the County desire to enter into a new Agreement whereby the County will continue to perform services within the boundaries of the City.

<u>Requested Action:</u> For Council to move the motion to GLS on May 14th, 2025, for consideration.
