You have to know someone already in the sport and secure an invite to ride (which is no easy task). Please, I beg you, my family begs you, provide an area where we can ride. Evergreen speedway had the perfect setup for year round riding. The outdoor track was amazing and had plenty of room for the track and parking. It was affordable to get there not having to drive a million miles away and we could hang out with all our local moto family friends whilst having fun doing something active that the whole family could participate in. Please bring it back!! We will show up and our family sport will continue to grow and support the business around us while we do so!

Hello Snohomish City Council members!

I want to take a minute and tell you about my son. He has always loved to ride. We got him a power wheels quad when he was 1. By 2, he would stand on the seat, drive it over things and just loved it to pieces. He graduated to a bigger quad at 4 and would do wheelies and drift it around corners. I can't explain how easy this all came to him.

In kindergarten it was discovered that he had a vision issue that affected his learning. He really struggled academically. It affected his mental health. He would tell me he is stupid. That he isn't like other kids. He was really down on himself. We were going to specialists 3 days a week after school.

Our whole life felt like school and specialists. It all felt so draining but we tried our best to help him catch up.

It was at this time that we bought him his first dirtbike. He raced for the first time at 7. He wasn't good at first and it took time to learn the sport but eventually he became one of the best at his age. Racing is his life. He feels like a superstar on that bike. It has helped him feel better about himself in ways I will never be able to truly explain. It has helped him grow and mature. He has to dig deep when things are tough, get back up after a fall, learn to listen to instructors, and to be a gracious loser when he doesn't win. There are so many things that come out of this sport that are AMAZING. It gave him a renewed energy that he could put into his learning. I am proud to say he is 11 now and is at grade level for his academics. It was a long road. I honestly believe without racing he would never have had the self confidence he has now.

Unfortunately, we are slowly losing all of our facilities. We only have a handful of places to ride on our side of the state and your current facility is the only one in all of western Washington that we can count on with our crazy PNW weather.

These kids and adults who ride deserve to be recognized just like any other sport. My son now races on a national level and our kids here in Washington are already at a disadvantage due to the weather and lack of facilities. For example a kid in California gets to ride 10 times to my kids 1 time. We often have to travel far to ride and everytime we lose a facility here that gets worse.

I strongly urge you to find a more permanent solution to keep these riders on their bikes as much as possible.

Because WHR Arenacross is the premier amateur dirt bike racing series in the Pacific Northwest during the winter months and one of the few racing series of any kind during that time of year, the Arenacross and Flat Track events at Evergreen State Fairgrounds account for up to 30% of my annual revenue. It also draws people not only from across the State of Washington, but Oregon, British Columbia and Idaho and even some from Montana and California, who not only bring themselves and their families but their spending power to Snohomish County.

When looking beyond dirt bikes and Arenacross, Flat Track racers do have an alternative indoor Flat Track race series (albeit a smaller one) during the winter at the Washington State Fairgrounds in Puyallup. However, the arena in Puyallup is significantly smaller than the one at Evergreen State Fair and simply can't accommodate many of the vehicle types which are represented in Monroe like karts, quarter-midgets and cage karts. This is in addition to the Puyallup arena being wholly unsuitable for arenacross/motocross activities. The Evergreen State Fairground is simply the only option for those race disciplines.



I am writing in hopes to give you a peak into a big part of our life before your team decides on the future of arenacross in Monroe wa.







Dear Snohomish County Council,

I am writing regarding my concern of the loss of Motorsports at the Monroe Fairgrounds. Thank you for taking the time to read my message.

My son is young and as a family who loves motorcycles of all kinds, street bikes and dirt bikes I wanted to share some of my perspective about how this can and will affect my family!

As a parent women I started riding dirtbikes late in my life, around 26.... I am 35 years old now and I didn't get an opportunity to ride when I was young. The foundation and skills of riding off road are vastly important to keeping our children safe... these kids will eventually be riding on Snohomish Country Roads at some point in their life when they have the ability ride off road they will be incredibly skilled individuals when they start paying tabs and taxes and riding on our public streets. If they can control a vehicle which is moving freely in the dirt, they will be prepared for events on the pavement, like debris in the road, gravel, reaction time, ect. The ability to ride an practice in a controlled environment is an enormous benefit to our young riders! They learn all the benefits from dirt biking and this will make them wonderful safe well rounded riders who will eventually be on our streets.

I know this from experience, if it wasn't for the skills I have learned dirt-bike riding, I may not be alive today. However I started riding very late in my life and I can only imagine how much better of a rider I would be if I had started when I was young. Because I have had the opportunity to ride arena -cross and motorcross at the Monroe fairgrounds, when I hit a patch of gravel on my street bike driving at night on Snohomish county roads, I was able to save the bike from crashing into pavement, thus preventing me from getting into an accident. I owe every bit of control in that situation to my experiences in dirtbike riding. So if want better riders and citizens sharing the road, needing less facilities and tax payer dollars used for fatalities and accidents, I can suggest that we should consider keeping this amenity as the skills learned at the Monroe fairgrounds are absolutely imperative to the safe riding and driving of so many who will eventually be on the dangerous roadway.

My son is 5 and will be headed into Motorsport here soon, and the news that we may loose this opportunity for our future generations is absolutely heartbreaking! Having a controlled area to practice is such an amazing benefit to new riders. We owe this safe place to our future generations of moto riders! Like I said before these riders are THE FUTURE of all motorcyclists on our physical road ways!

My son is currently riding an electric motor bike, and the Flat Track has offered him some of his very first experiences on the flat track, getting him used to crowds and noise and riding with other kids, For the very first time!!!! If we are the loose this, I am not quite sure where we will be able to go, and that dreams and hopes will be undoubtedly shattered.

For the safety of our future Motorsport generations please consider allowing WHR Motorsports to use the facility. Snohomish county is severely lacking safe riding places for small children..



Austin could easily be hanging out with his friends but instead he has learned how to work hard and earn some money. Austin also races every Sunday during the season. He has learned so much from racing go karts and seeing his confidence go up each and every week has been something every parent wants for their child. This is NO equal replacement for the Evergreen fair grounds Indoor Arena in Snohomish county and there for, it is my understand that the county can not consider moving WHR Motorsports from the Evergreen Fairground arena that is managed by Snohomish County.

I have known Lee Collins with WHR Motorsports since I was 10 years old. So for about 38 years now. I want to take a minute and tell you about my son. He has always loved to ride. We got him a power wheels quad when he was 1. By 2, he would stand on the seat, drive it over things and just loved it to pieces. He graduated to a bigger quad at 4 and would do wheelies and drift it around corners. I can't explain how easy this all came to him.

In kindergarten it was discovered that he had a vision issue that affected his learning. He really struggled academically. It affected his mental health. He would tell me he is stupid. That he isn't like other kids. He was really down on himself. We were going to specialists 3 days a week after school.

Our whole life felt like school and specialists. It all felt so draining but we tried our best to help him catch up.

It was at this time that we bought him his first dirtbike. He raced for the first time at 7. He wasn't good at first and it took time to learn the sport but eventually he became one of the best at his age. Racing is his life. He feels like a superstar on that bike. It has helped him feel better about himself in ways I will never be able to truly explain. It has helped him grow and mature. He has to dig deep when things are tough, get back up after a fall, learn to listen to instructors, and to be a gracious loser when he doesn't win. There are so many things that come out of this sport that are AMAZING. It gave him a renewed energy that he could put into his learning. I am proud to say he is 11 now and is at grade level for his academics. It was a long road. I honestly believe without racing he would never have had the self confidence he has now.

Unfortunately, we are slowly losing all of our facilities. We only have a handful of places to ride on our side of the state and your current facility is the only one in all of western Washington that we can count on with our crazy PNW weather.

These kids and adults who ride deserve to be recognized just like any other sport. My son now races on a national level and our kids here in Washington are already at a disadvantage due to the weather and lack of facilities. For example a kid in California gets to ride 10 times to my kids 1 time. We often have to travel far to ride and everytime we lose a facility here that gets worse.

I strongly urge you to find a more permanent solution to keep these riders on their bikes as much as possible.

I hope you can see that it really means the world to many of them 💙





My name is Troy Tangen. I have rode motorcycle for 43 years and have made a career in the motorcycle industry for the past 28 years.

I have seen a lot of our riding access dwindle in this state. I have seen the economic impact to our motorcycle dealers when a riding area is no longer available. For example when MXGP in Monroe closed, Monroe Kawasaki (since closed) went from selling roughly 250 five gallon pails of race fuel to under 10 per year. At a cost of \$85 per 5 gallons their sales went from \$21,250.00 a year to under \$850.00. That was only one dealer. We are and industry that the public flocked to during the pandemic because we offer good, clean fun for families.

Over those 28 years, we have lost a lot more riding areas than we have gained. Monroe indoor flat track and arena cross events are a generational types of events. Fathers and Mothers take their children to the same events that they rode years ago.

Please help us keep access to the fairgrounds and please help us obtain more public riding areas.
