Code Amendment Budget Action Other Requested Handling: Normal Expedite Urgent	<u>Scope:</u>	Snohomish County is providing funding to Machinists Institute to increase capacity for their childcare facility and to allow more working parents to access the hands-on training for high paying jobs in high demand fields. Scope of work includes the renovation of an existing building to meet licensing requirements as a childcare center, and the development of dedicated outdoor space for nature-based childcare programming. Both childcare programs will be managed by the Machinist Institute. The agreement is through September 30, 2026, with a maximum amount of \$500,000, which is in the form of a forgivable loan. The loan will bear no interest and will be forgiven by December 31, 2034 so long as the Machinist Institute fulfills its obligations under the construction and reimbursement period of this agreement.
