1. Ordinance 23-076, approving and authorizing the Snohomish
County Executive to sign the Interlocal Agreement between
Snohomish County and the Stillaguamish Tribe of Indians for Wood
Acquisition to Support Jim Creek Restoration Project

Council Chair Mead opened the hearing and the clerk read the ordinance title into the record.

Ryan Countryman, Senior Legislative Analyst, provided an overview of the proposed agreement for the County to purchase wood material from the Stillaguamish Tribe at a cost of \$30,600.

Council Chair Mead opened the hearing for public testimony. There being no persons present wishing to testify, he closed the testimony portion of the hearing calling for a motion or discussion of the Council.

**ACTION:** Councilmember Low made a motion to approve Ordinance 23-076. Councilmember Dunn seconded the motion. The clerk called the roll and the motion to approve Ordinance 23-076 carried unanimously by the four members present.

2. Ordinance 23-067, relating to sponsorships and licenses at County Parks and the Fair Park, amending Chapters 2.32 SCC and adding new Sections to Chapters 2.16 and 2.32 SCC

Council Chair Mead opened the hearing and the clerk read the ordinance title into the record.

Deb Bell, Senior Legislative Analyst, provided a staff report explaining the proposed Code amendments to allow for licenses and sponsorship agreements for contributions to park properties and the Evergreen State Fairgrounds.

Councilmember Dunn requested a continuance of the public hearing as staff works on drafting an amendment to the ordinance to provide a monetary threshold amount for sponsorships that would require Council review and approval. She noted that the amendment will also include an annual reporting of sponsorships.

Tom Teigen, Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) Director, along with Sharon Swan, DCNR Parks Division Director, responded to questions and expressed support of the Councilmember Dunn's proposed amendment to the ordinance.

Discussion ensued relating to potential investors and sponsors, as well as public-private partnerships that align with the mission and vision for County Parks.

Councilmember Low noted support of the proposed amendment, provided that there are no impacts to the Evergreen Speedway activities and operations.

Council Chair Mead opened the hearing for public testimony. There being no persons present wishing to testify, he closed the testimony portion of the hearing calling for a motion or discussion of the Council.

**ACTION:** Councilmember Dunn made a motion to continue the public hearing for Ordinance 23-067 to August 30, 2023, at the hour of 10:30 a.m. Councilmember Low seconded the motion and it carried unanimously by the four members present.
