Consideration

Ordinance related to the 2022 budget making a supplemental appropriation in County Solid Waste Fund 402 to provide additional expenditure authority for the Waste Export Program, under Snohomish County Charter 6.80.

Background

The Solid Waste Management Division requires a supplemental appropriation of \$3,500,000.00 to its Waste Export Program budget to ensure the Division has enough budgetary authority to continue export operations through the remainder of 2022.

Municipal Solid Waste tonnage processed through August of 2022 is up 4.6% compared to this same time frame in 2021. Due to this unanticipated growth in tonnage and the related costs to process the additional waste, the Division will exhaust the budgetary authority prior to the end of the 2022 budget. The additional costs will be covered by tip fee revenues (up 5.3%) from the additional tonnage processed over same time frame.

Current Proposal

Pursuant to County Charter 6.80¹, a supplemental appropriation is needed because the funds which support the Solid Waste Division were unanticipated at the time of the budget approval and appropriation for the year 2022. Approval by ordinance is sought from Council to authorize the supplemental appropriation in Solid Waste Management Fund 402.
