

2023 Historic Preservation Grants Recommendations Summary

Background Summary: By providing matching funds on a competitive basis, the Historic Preservation Program supports projects that promote the public's access to county history. Funding is available for professional development, public education, and capital improvements or collections management. Money is awarded from recording fees collected by the Snohomish County Auditor. The allocation of these fees for projects that "promote historical preservation or historical programs, which may include preservation of historic documents" is authorized under RCW 36.22.170. The revenues accrue to a dedicated fund and may not be used for any purposes other than those stipulated in the RCW.

Summary: The commission met on February 21, 2023 to review 13 grant requests. Commissioners Loren Kraetz, Jennifer Hushour, Frederick Cruger, Chris Jenkins and Franklin Ng, Cheri Ryan were present. There were \$178,364.00 in grant requests which were submitted for \$100,000 in grant funding. The Historic Preservation Commission recommends grant funding to 9 out of the 13 projects reviewed:

Project: ADA Improvements Lynnwood Urban Railcar

Project Budget: \$ 20,180

Amount Requested: \$15,980

Recommendation: \$ \$15,980 full funding recommended



Purchase of a wheelchair lift and a lighter hatch to facilitate ADA access to the historic Urban Streetcar (Trolley) #55.

Project Applicant: City of Granite Falls Historical Society

Project: Newspaper Digitization Sno-Isle Library

Project Budget: \$20,000

Amount Requested: \$19,500

Recommendation: \$19,500 full funding recommended



The project proposes to digitize Snohomish Tribune newspapers from 1921 through 1941 (completing the pre-war era). The previous endeavor digitized newspapers from 1910 to 1920. This project is a continuation.

Project Applicant: Sky Valley Arts Council

Project: Public Mural-Honoring Boeda Strand

Project Budget: \$26,400

Amount Requested: \$20,000

Recommendation: No Funding recommended



This project will produce a public mural honoring Sultan John’s sister and basket maker Boeda Strand. The mural will incorporate public involvement during its creation. The mural will benefit tourism and history in the City of Sultan.

Project Applicant: HistoryLink

Project: Snohomish County Writing our History

Project Budget: \$33,230

Amount Requested: \$8,000

Recommendation: \$8,000 full funding recommended



Project will add Snohomish County content to HistoryLink.org focusing on Snohomish County people, businesses and places that have shaped the County’s history. The 2023 focus will include 13 new articles and a one self-guided walking tour available online.

Project: Storage Capacity Expansion

Project Budget: \$3,799

Amount Requested: \$3,099

Recommendation: \$3,099 full funding recommended



Digitization of remaining newspaper collection as well as an early school newspaper and several smaller short-lived local papers. The digitization will preserve some of the more fragile newspapers and make them available to the public online.

Project Applicant: Sno-Isle Genealogical Society

Project: Newspaper Digitization-Edmond Tribune

Project Budget: \$19,114.20

Amount Requested: \$20,000

Recommendation: \$19,000 partial funding actual estimate of costs rec.



Digitization of the Edmonds Tribune from 1908 to 1927 and further if funding allows. This project will make these newspapers available and searchable by the public online.

Project Applicant: Stillaguamish Valley Pioneer Museum #1
Project: Maintain and Digitize glass negatives and other photographs
Project Budget: \$11,411.50
Amount Requested: \$10,586
Recommendation: \$ 4,890 Partial funding recommended



This project will clean, digitize and preserve 1,179 glass negatives, oversize photos and pioneer family photos. The commission voted to fund only the cleaning of glass negatives since this requires some expertise. No expenses for other activities as previous grants have funded the purchase of scanners, computers and software specifically for the purpose of digitization of historic photographs. The latter can be accomplished in-house by volunteers and does not require special skills.

Project Budget: \$20,886.61
Amount Requested: \$13,500
Recommendation: \$13,500 full funding recommended



The project proposes to replace the roof on the historic Shannahan Cabin at the EvergreenState Fair Park. The roof is deteriorated and allowing water to damage the interior. The Shannahan Cabin is the first building on the Snohomish County Register of Historic Places.
