2023 - 2024 SCHOOL DISTRICT

100% of PSTAA funds allocated to School Districts must be expended on improving educational outcomes for early learning through programs for children and youth that are low-income, homeless, or in foster care, or other vulnerable populations. At least fifty percent (50%) of funds shall be designated for use with community-based early learning programs, defined as those programs serving children from birth through the third grade. PSTAA fund recipients shall expend a portion of their PSTAA funds on new programs that will foster collaboration and innovation, and that leverage partnerships with community based early learning organizations and agencies to increase the likelihood of improving early learning outcomes.

Description of proposed use of funds:

We have hired a certificated teacher to support our early learning program and to especially focus on our multilingual students who are in our early learning program. This teacher will support professional development, instruction, and the services needed to support our multilingual families integrate into the educational opportunities provided in the Northshore School District.

Proposed performance indicators for educational outcome(s):

We would like to see fewer multilingual students qualify for special education services unless their needs warrant specially designed instruction. With these funds we can support students utilizing our multi-tiered system of supports (MTSS) providing tiered intervention supports, meeting the students where and when they

need them without the need for an Individualized Education Plan (IEP). This would allow the student to transition into kindergarten within the general education setting.

Description of proposed use of funds:

We will continue our partnership with the Imagine Children's Museum to design educational hands-on experiences for multilingual learners, students with special needs, students from families with lower incomes when they come to the museum so they may experience STEM opportunities in an equitable fashion to those who do not experience these opportunity gaps.

We would also like to support scholarship opportunities for students from families who may come from lower income brackets, multilingual homes, and homes with students with special needs. The museum currently provides free nights for families and passes that allow families to come to the museum at times that work for their schedules.

Proposed performance indicators for educational outcome(s):

We intend to build on the participation in our early childhood educational opportunities by students and families from students from lower income brackets, those who speak languages other than English, and families caring for students with special needs. We also will foster our relationship with the museum to encourage families to visit the museum as a family experience that benefits and builds strong relationships within the family unit.
