Dear Commissioner Franz and Board of Natural Resources,


Snohomish County recognizes the Department of Natural Resource's (DNR) commitment to manage state trust lands sustainably and appreciates the recent collaboration while identifying trust lands for inclusion in the 2023 Natural Climate Solutions (NSC) Carbon Sequestration Forest Proviso. The County is also encouraged to see additional appropriation in the 2024 Supplemental Budget to continue the conservation efforts of structurally complex, carbon-dense forestland in the Stillaguamish watershed in Snohomish County.


The Snohomish County Council strongly supports the preservation of a minimum of 10-15% of DNR's mature and old-growth forests as committed to in the 2006 Policy for Sustainable Forests (DNR Resolution 1208) and believes that these older forests play a critical role in avoiding devastating wildfires, ensuring clean air and water, sustaining diverse plant and animal life and are essential for addressing the global climate and biodiversity challenges.


In support of those values, the Snohomish County Council requests the following efforts: an accurate and complete accounting of our mature and old-growth forests and harvest projections (acreage amount of stands that are not mature forests and are ready for harvest in the next 1-3 years, and the acreage of timber sales planned for harvest in the next 3 years that do not contain mature forests); and a forest preservation plan in our County which is in line with the 10-15% preservation goal.

We appreciate the continued partnership with DNR, our trust land beneficiaries and Tribal partners and request ongoing collaboration in establishing a plan to sustainably manage all forests in Snohomish County, balancing the short-term accrual losses to beneficiaries with the protection of our mature forests.
