## **Management Report**

- Enrollment Update at the end of April
  - o Enrolled at 82
  - There is currently one vacancy it is NOT over 30 days
  - There are eligible children and pregnant people on the waitlist

- Program will continue to over-enroll, as possible, to ensure full enrollment as children exit
- Enrollment Initiative Update
  - o Program received notification of completion of the initial Enrollment Initiative
  - Requires that the program maintains full enrollment for an additional 6 months beginning February 2025, per verbal conversation
  - o Program has met full enrollment criteria for February, March April, and May
  - Summer months are not used to capture full enrollment data; October is the end of our six-month maintenance period
- Staffing updates
  - No staffing updates
- Program Information Data September 2024 thru April 2025
  - See below
- Policy Council Update
  - o Policy Council met February, March, April and May
  - They completed an Orientation to EHS Budget (required training)
  - They completed ERSEA Training and approved changes to ERSEA Policy and Selection Criteria
  - They were provided an overview of the Renewal Application process and their role and responsibilities
  - They were provided an update on OHS changes and new directives
- Program Updates Governing Board
  - EHS monthly reports for January March 2025 have been submitted to and accepted by County Council.
  - Governing Body and Health and Safety Screener Review was completed, uploaded to HSES, and accepted.
  - Governing Body completed required annual Program Governance and ERSEA Training as reported by Snohomish County Council Chief of Staff
- Other Updates
  - EHS has a contract for a new space for use at the Marysville Civic Center that will allow for flexibility with times that socializations and family events can be scheduled. The space is safe and ideal for gross motor development activities.

## **Updates Office of Head Start**

- Contract Close-out for 2020 2024 grant
  - o Required to complete 120 days after contract end date (April 30, 2025)
  - County staff have submitted all required documents with the exception of one form that requires changes by OHS – this is in process; staff have submitted communication documenting our efforts and noting OHS is responsible for the delay
- Notice of Award
  - Snohomish County is anticipating Notice of Award (NOA) for second half of funding.
- New Directives changes to our website
- Change in OHS Head Start Regions
  - o Region X office closed
  - New region is OHS West
