RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF INFORMATION SERVICES;
AMENDING CHAPTER 2.350 SCC

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED:

Section 1. Snohomish County Code Chapter 2.350.015, last amended by Ordinance No. 16-040 on June 22, 2016 is amended to read:

2.350.015 Legislative intent.

The department shall perform planning, maintenance and operational management of county information and technology products and services. ~~((which))~~ These products and services support other county departments and public agencies who have intergovernmental agreements with Snohomish County to receive information technology services. It is recognized that information systems, telecommunications, equipment, software, and services must satisfy the business needs of county departments and their end users and that many a ppropriate and cost-effective alternatives exist for meeting those needs ~~((,))~~ ~~((such))~~ such as shared computing, shared telecommunications services, communication networks, departmental applications, and computer systems. It is the intent of this chapter that:

- (1) Information be shared and administered in a coordinated manner, except when prevented by county department responsibilities for compliance, security, privacy, or confidentiality; and
- (2) Resources be used in the most efficient manner; and
- (3) A structure be created (a) to plan and manage telecommunications and computing network, (b) to increase agencies' awareness of information and technology sharing opportunities, and (c) to support and serve agencies by implementing such possibilities; and
- (4) The acquisition of equipment, proprietary software, software as a service solutions, and related services to support the information technology needs of the county be evaluated and reviewed to ensure conformity with county standards; and
- (5) The county improve recruitment, training, and retention of professional staff; and

- 1 (6) Plans, proposals, and acquisitions for information services be reviewed from a
2 technical, financial and management perspective as part of the budget process;

- 5 (7) County elected officials be given meaningful opportunities to contribute to the
6 prioritization, development, and delivery of information services to county
7 departments.

9 Section 2. Snohomish County Code Chapter 2.350.020, last amended by
10 Ordinance No. 16-079 on October 19, 2016 is amended to read:

12 **2.350.020 Definitions.**
13

14 The following definitions shall apply to terms used in this chapter, unless the
15 context indicates otherwise:

- 17 (1) "Council" means the Snohomish county council;

- 19 (2) "Executive" means the Snohomish county executive;

- 21 (3) "Department" means the department of information technology;

- 23 (4) "Director and county chief information officer" means the director of the
24 department of information technology;
- 25 (5) "Information processing" means the electronic capture, collection, storage,
26 manipulation, transmission, retrieval, and presentation of information in the
27 form of data, text, voice, or image and includes telecommunications and office
28 automation functions;

- 30 (6) "Information services" means information processing, software operation,
31 telecommunications, and office automation;

- 33 (7) "Equipment" means the machines, devices, and transmission facilities used in
34 information processing, software operation, telecommunications, networking, and
35 office automation;

38 (9) "Telecommunications" means the transmission of information by wire,
39 radio, optical cable, electromagnetic, or other means;

4 (11) "Purchased services" means services provided by a vendor to accomplish
5 routine, continuing and necessary functions. This term includes, but is not
6 limited to, services acquired for equipment maintenance and repair, operation
7 of a physical plant, security, computer hardware and software installation and
8 maintenance, data entry, programming services, training, consulting services
9 and computer time-sharing;

11 (12) "Support services" are defined but not limited to the following:

13 (a) Copy and printing services that provide centralized photo
14 copying and printing services for Snohomish county customers;

16 (b) Mail service for Snohomish county customers; and
17 (c) Micrographic and digital scanning records management services
18 that assist Snohomish county customers to provide for the

20 records and reports in accordance with state archiving statutes.

2 Beginning in 2017 and every three years thereafter, the director shall prepare
3 and submit a strategic technology plan to the executive, which the executive shall
4 submit to the council. The director may provide the executive with an annual
5 update to the strategic plan to incorporate changes driven by innovation within
6 the technology industry and changing business needs within the county. The
7 strategic technology plan will address the overall technology and information
8 management strategy for the county covering a 36-month period and align such
9 strategy to the business and service goals, strategies, objectives, and plans of
10 the county and its departments. Prior to submitting the plan to the executive, the
11 director shall ~~((submit the plan to the SAB for review))~~ seek feedback on the plan
12 from all county department heads and may perform other external review. The
13 plan must contain the following:

12 created by SCC 4.114.010 and the data processing capital improvement fund
13 (fund 315) created by SCC 4.66.010 in the standard county five-year projection

17 data processing capital improvement fund (fund 315), including the most recent

5 appropriate stakeholder groups. The organization of these reviews will be defined
6 by the director and may be focused on high level reviews with stakeholders and
7 the executive, or more detailed operational updates for the specific impacts of
8 projects focused on a single or smaller group of county departments.
9

10 Section 14. Effective Date. This ordinance takes effect 10 days after it is signed
11 by the county executive or otherwise enacted

13 Section 15. Severability. If any provision of this ordinance or its application or
14 circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance and the application of its
15 provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected.

EXECUTIVE RECOMMENDATION: Approve - Ken Klein 1/31/22

PURPOSE: Amend Snohomish County Code (SCC) Chapter 2.350 - Department of Information Services

BACKGROUND: Chapter SCC 2.350 pertains to the Snohomish County Department of Information Services and related authority, functions, reporting, planning, rates, and governance. Existing code language contains outdated references to Information Technology (IT) solutions and services that need to be updated. Additionally, current code sections detail a restrictive and multi-faceted approach to IT governance that does not reflect existing decision making and planning efforts as we move forward our modern IT organization. This proposed code amendment establishes direction for a more progressive IT department that aligns strong accountability with an agile guidebook for managing the modern business of IT in Snohomish County.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS:

The department shall perform planning, maintenance and operational management of county information and technology products and services. ~~((which))~~ These products and services support other county departments and public agencies who have intergovernmental agreements with Snohomish County to receive information technology services. It is recognized that information systems, telecommunications, equipment, software, and services must satisfy the business needs of county departments and their end users and that many appropriate and cost-effective alternatives exist for meeting those needs, such as shared computing, shared telecommunications services, communication networks, departmental applications, and computer systems. It is the intent of this chapter that:

- (1) Information be shared and administered in a coordinated manner, except when prevented by county department responsibilities for compliance, security, privacy, or confidentiality; and
- (2) Resources be used in the most efficient manner; and
- (3) A structure be created (a) to plan and manage telecommunications and computing network, (b) to increase agencies' awareness of information and technology sharing opportunities, and (c) to support and serve agencies by implementing such possibilities; and
- (4) The acquisition of equipment, proprietary software, software as a service solutions, and related services to support the information technology needs of the county be evaluated and reviewed to ensure conformity with county standards; and
