<u>Authority Granted</u>: Authorizes the Executive to execute the contract and future amendments.

Background: The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program is funded by the United States Department of Health and Human Services¹ through the Washington State Department of Commerce. The Energy Assistance Program provides financial assistance to low-income households for heating expenses. The intent of the program is to help low-income households with the rising home energy costs.

The program typically opens around November 15 and closes when all funds are spent, typically April 1. The money used for this program are federal funds, annually distributed to counties through the Washington State Department of Commerce. The maximum benefit an individual can receive is \$1,000 per heating season. The amount an individual receives is dependent on their income, household size, type of housing, and heating bill.
