Section 1. Adopts findings and recitals in support of establishing a requirement for grocery employees to receive hazard pay for work performed in unincorporated Snohomish County during the COVID-19 emergency will promote job retention, compensate them for the risks of working on the frontlines of a global pandemic, improve their financial ability to access resources for protecting themselves and their families from catching or spreading the virus or coping with illness caused by the virus, and support the welfare of the greater community that depends on grocery employees for safe and reliable access to food.

Section 2. As substantive effects of the ordinance are not permanent, the ordinance is not intended to be codified. Section numbers are for ease of reference within the ordinance, and section and subsection references refer to numbers in the ordinance unless stated otherwise. The section outlines definitions, employee coverage, employer coverage, hazard pay requirements, notice and posting, employer records, prohibition of retaliation, private right of action, waiver, encouragement of more generous policies, other legal requirements, severability, and repeal. At the hearing, the Council may also consider alternatives/ amendments to the proposed ordinance.

The section outlines definitions, employee coverage, employer coverage, hazard pay requirements, notice and posting, employer records, prohibition of retaliation, private right of action, waiver, encouragement of more generous policies, other legal requirements, severability, and repeal.

The Council amended the ordinance for hazard pay to be capped at the pre-tax amount of One Thousand Two-Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$1,250.00) per employee.
