Subject: Interlocal Agreement with Everett and Port of Everett.

Funding for the County's share of the project is available in the current Park's capital budget.

Authority Granted:

- Authorization to Executive to execute the Interlocal Agreement.
- Authorization to the DCNR director to approve amendments which do not obligate the County monetarily.
- Delegation to the Port of Everett the project management and responsibility at the Port's sole cost for ongoing operation and maintenance of the project.

Background:

Snohomish County, the Port of Everett and City of Everett collectively acquired the 10th Street Boat Launch, with Jetty Landing Park facilities, in 1972 to provide recreation opportunities. Since that time, the three parties have collaborated on several projects including some formalized through interlocal agreements.

The current interlocal agreement describes responsibilities for each owner with respect to replacing boat launch floats. The Port will be the project lead, overseeing the project and applying for grant funding to support the work. All three owners will provide 1/3 of the required grant match, not to exceed \$83,333.33 per party (or \$250,000 local match). The total project cost estimate is \$1,250,000. The Port intends to seek grants funding of \$1,000,000.
