**RECOGNIZING MAY 5, 2024, IN CELEBRATION OF CINCO DE MAYO
IN SNOHOMISH COUNTY**

***WHEREAS,** Cinco de Mayo is celebrated annually as a date of tremendous significance by the Mexican and Mexican-American communities in Snohomish County and across our nation; and*

***WHEREAS,** Cinco de Mayo commemorates the victory of the Mexican Army over France at the Battle of Puebla in 1862 during the Franco-Mexican War; and*

***WHEREAS,** Snohomish County is home to a large Latino population who celebrate the Cinco de Mayo holiday; and*

***WHEREAS,** the Cinco de Mayo holiday is a celebration of individual bravery and patriotism of all Mexicans and Mexican-Americans who fought for freedom and independence against heavily-armed invading French military forces; and*

***WHEREAS,** Cinco de Mayo serves as a reminder that the United States is comprised of people from around the world with diverse cultures who are willing to fight and die for freedom; and*

***WHEREAS,** Cinco de Mayo also underscores the close familial, cultural, spiritual, and economic ties between the people of Mexico and the people of the United States; and*

***WHEREAS,** Snohomish County recognizes the strong commitment to carry forward this annual tradition to honor Mexican identity and promote cultural awareness; and*


***WHEREAS,** Cinco de Mayo is emblematic of the right to self-determination, just as Benito Juarez once stated, “El respeto al derecho ajeno es la paz” (“The respect of other people’s rights is peace”);*




