Subject: Interlocal Agreement (ILA) Between Snohomish County and East County Park and Recreation District for Phase 1 of Maltby Sports Park Project

Scope: The proposed interlocal agreement would provide financial assistance to the East County Park and Recreation District (ECPRD) for a feasibility study to convert grass sports fields to synthetic turf at Maltby Community Park. ECPRD will provide

- monthly progress reports
- draft reports related to site assessment, schematic plan, and cost estimates
- copies of all materials produced by the consultant for the project

The total cost is not to exceed \$385,250.

Duration: The proposed agreement will take effect upon mutual execution through December 31, 2026

Authority Granted: Ordinance 26-006 approves and authorizes the Snohomish County Executive to sign the Interlocal Agreement between Snohomish County and East County Park and Recreation District for Phase I of Maltby Sports Park Project. It further authorizes the Director of the County's Conservation and Natural Resources Department to approve amendments to this agreement without additional approval from the County Council or the County Executive.

Background: East County Park and Recreation District (ECPRF) owns, manages, and maintains Maltby Community Park. The property has grass sports fields that ECPRD would like to convert to synthetic surfaces to benefit the local community and citizens of Snohomish County.

The County recognizes the opportunity to expand and enhance the existing facilities, and it is in the public interest of County residents to participate in joint undertakings to increase recreational opportunities and facility capacity.

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Maltby Community Park is within the service area and meets the intent of the mitigation agreement with King County for the Brightwater Sewage Treatment Plant. Mitigation funding received because of this agreement may be used for projects within the Brightwater area for active recreation facilities and improvements.

Requested Action: Move to GLS on February 25, 2026, to set time and date for a public hearing. Proposed date for the public hearing is Wednesday, March 18 at 10:30 a.m.
