Subject: Adopting changes in voting precincts pursuant to RCW 29A.16.040, RCW 29A.16.050 and Chapter 2.47 SCC; Amending Chapter 2.47 Snohomish County Code.

Fiscal Impact: Current Year Multi-Year N/A

Background: Under Snohomish County Code [2.47](#), the Snohomish County Auditor may temporarily adjust precinct boundaries to account for changes following the federal decennial census, annexations to cities/districts and population shifts. Additionally, Snohomish County Code allows the Snohomish County Auditor to temporarily adjust precinct boundaries under the provisions of [RCW 29A.16.040](#) and [RCW 29A.161.050](#). An ordinance submitted to the Council to adjust voting precinct boundaries must be adopted by Council no later than April 15, 2026.

Under RCW 29A.16.040, the Snohomish County Auditor may adjust precinct boundaries at any time unless it is within 14 days of the first day candidates can begin to file for the primary election.

Requested Action: Move to Council to set time and date for a Public Hearing.
