Consideration

The Executive's Office requests Council consider approving proposed Motion 21-407 which would approve and authorize an Interlocal Agreement between the County and the City of Snohomish.

Background

The Sheriff's office has provided law enforcement services for the City of Snohomish (City) since 2012. Both parties would like to continue these services until the end of 2023.

Current Proposal

Scope: Motion 21-407 approves an agreement for the County to provide law enforcement services in the City of Snohomish. Under this agreement, the County provides:

 Base Level Services outlined under section 1.0 to include patrol; investigation; special services; support services; records management; evidence management; police department services and activities related to the City's Resolution 08361

Services will be conducted by a Police Chief (Sheriff's Captain); five (5) Sheriff's Sergeants; nine (9) Deputy Sheriff's; two (2) Detectives; .5 LET² Lead; .5 Public Records and one (1) LES³ at a city facility (a \$2,925 monthly credit⁴ will be given to the City for use of the facility). Services will be conducted within the City limits and assigned county personnel will have exclusive use of marked vehicle and uniforms with identification determined by the City.

The City will provide use of the facility as well as civilian support staff.

Duration: 1/1/2022 – 12/31/2023 Fiscal Implications: \$7,206,690

2022 Budget: \$3,549,921

Future Budget Impacts: \$3,656,769 - all costs for 2023 include a 3% annual increase for CPI/COLA
