Deputies with the **Snohomish County Sheriff's Office of Neighborhoods (OON)** & **SCOUT** members team up to improve response & provide increased follow-up to people who are chronically homeless & who frequently utilize human services.

Whether responding to trespass/nuisance requests, code enforcement, or interacting with larger homeless encampments, this co-response approach helps connect people to services & lessens the likelihood of re-offending, law enforcement contact, or incarceration.



SCOUT

The Snohomish County Human Services Department has social service specialists, licensed substance use professionals, & licensed counselors providing outreach & engagement to unhoused community members with unmet behavioral health needs.

SCOUT members work independently throughout the County & jointly with the **Snohomish County Sheriff's Office, Jail, Community Transit, & Arlington, Lynnwood, Monroe, & Mountlake Terrace Police Departments.**
