Amendment: Council staff suggests a verbal amendment to Motion 24-030 to revise the expiration date to be December 31, 2027, rather than 2028. This would make board member Misenar's second term end four years after the expiration of his first, consistent with SCC 3.42.010 and RCW 17.10.050.
