CALL TO ORDER

Council Chair Mead called the public hearing to order at 6:00 p.m.

ROLL CALL

The clerk called the roll and stated that all five members were present.

Nathan Kennedy, Finance Director, provided a high-level technical overview of the ECAFs, ordinances, and motions that comprise of the 2024 Executive's recommended Budget. There were no questions from councilmembers.

Tyler Verda, resident of the city of Everett, Human Services, and President of AFSCME 1811CA, spoke about the work done in Human Services.

Jason Johnson, resident of the city of Marysville and employee of Public Works Department, spoke about his job in Traffic Operations and asked Council to honor the wage and compensation study.

Greg Mackey, resident of the city of Granite Falls and employee of Solid Waste Department, spoke about his job and wages in Solid Waste.

Nancy LaJambe, resident of the city of Everett and employee of Human Services, spoke about her job and the services provided in Human Services.
