

PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 21-026

AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH PACIFIC NORTHWEST  
ECONOMIC REGION FOR MARITIME FOCUSED SUPPLY  
CHAIN WORKSHOPS

WHEREAS, the Snohomish County Department of Emergency Management (DEM) received a Regional Catastrophic Preparedness Grant in 2019, to analyze interruptions in supply chain logistics after a catastrophic earthquake, develop a GIS model to provide recommended sites for Community Points of Distribution (CPODs) for food and water within 8 counties in the Puget Sound Region, and connect the waterways to the transportation system for the movement of large goods and supplies after a major earthquake; and

WHEREAS, Pacific Northwest Economic Region (PNWER) is a statutory public/private non-profit created in 1991 by the states of Alaska, Idaho, Oregon, Montana, Washington, and the Canadian provinces of British Columbia, Alberta, Saskatchewan, and the Yukon and Northwest Territories; and

WHEREAS, PNWER conducted Transportation and Supply Chain workshops in 2013 in coordination with DEM for past Regional Catastrophic Preparedness Grant Program (RCPGP) grants, and published the Puget Sound Regional Catastrophic Preparedness Grant Program: Supply Chain Project and the Puget Sound Regional Maritime Transportation Disaster Recovery Exercise Program in 2014 as a result of these workshops; and

WHEREAS, the 2019 RCPGP grant builds off of past regional RCPGP projects, including the 2014 publications; and

WHEREAS, the total amount of this contract with PNWER, Inc. is not to exceed \$52,500.00; and

WHEREAS, the funds have been allocated within the DEM current budget for this purpose; and

WHEREAS, such agreements are authorized by and are consistent with the requirements of the Interlocal Cooperation Act, chapter 39.34 RCW; and

WHEREAS, the Snohomish County Council held a public hearing on \_\_\_\_\_, 2021, to consider approving an interlocal agreement with PNWER and authorizing the Snohomish County Executive to sign on behalf of the County such agreement when in substantially the same form as attached hereto as Exhibit A.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED:

Section 1. The County Council hereby adopts the foregoing recitals as findings of fact and conclusions as if set forth in full herein.

Section 2. The Snohomish County Council hereby approves and authorizes the Snohomish County Executive, or designee, to execute an interlocal agreement for Regional Catastrophic Preparedness Maritime Workshops with Pacific Northwest Economic Region (PNWER) in substantially the same form as attached to this ordinance as Exhibit A.

At the hearing, the Council may also consider alternatives/ amendments to the proposed ordinance.

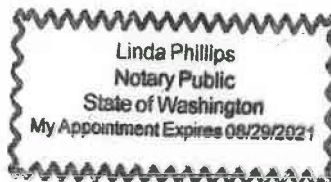
