2. Ordinance 23-061, related to the 2023 Budget; making a supplemental appropriation in Grant Fund 130 to provide expenditure authority for funds received from the Department of Treasury Local Assistance and Tribal Consistency Fund 2023-0646

Nicole Gorle, Senior Legislative Analyst, provided an overview on the proposed supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$1,010,078 received from grant funds for the Progressive Animal Welfare Society (PAWS).
