<u>Authority Granted:</u> Approve and authorize of the County Executive to sign the Interlocal Agreement between Snohomish County and the Alderwood Water and Wastewater District for Overlay Improvements, under SCC 13.01.020(5).

<u>Background:</u> Washington State RCW 39.34 provides for interlocal agreements between local agencies within the state for mutual advantage and thereby to provide services and facilities in a manner beneficial to both agencies. Snohomish County has been providing Overlay services to Alderwood Water and Wastewater District since 2013, and both parties agree that it is mutually beneficial for the County and the district to continue to work cooperatively.
