Promotores are community leaders who share environmental knowledge from their lived experience, in their native language. They bridge cultural gaps and ensure environmental education reaches all community members.

Our programs specifically reach Northwest Washington residents who **don't speak English fluently**, ensuring **inclusion, equity, and participation** in environmental protection.

Our Five Active Programs



Promotores of the Environment

Workshops on pollution, recycling, food Waste, conservation, e-waste recycling events, and community awareness initiatives. Supported by Solid Waste, SW.



Promotores of Water

Education on responsible water use, waste prevention, and protection of water bodies. Includes rain barrel workshops with 26 projects completed. Supported by Surface Water Management, SWM.



Promotores of Climate

Workshops and community actions addressing climate change challenges and solutions.
Currently inactive due to lack of funding.



Latino Fix / Repair Café

Repair workshops preventing waste generation and providing financial relief for over 50 participating families. Supported by Solid Waste, SW.



Recycling & Art Workshops

Holiday crafts and creation of safe, affordable household cleaning products that are non-toxic alternatives. Supported by Solid Waste, SW.



Measurable Actions & Results

Water Conservation

26 rain barrels completed by Promotores of Water graduates, teaching families how to collect and reuse water sustainably. In our Promotores del Agua course-SWM

Safe Disposal

Our solid waste workshops help the community safely manage household and community waste, reducing environmental contamination ,Supported by Promotores -SW

Waste Reduction

Over 50 participants in Latino Fix repaired items, preventing them from going to landfill and saving money for families. Supported by Promotores -SW

Non-Toxic Solutions

Homemade Cleaning Workshops taught participants to make safe, non-corrosive, and cost-effective household products. Supported by Promotores -SW
