Background:

The Board: The Commission is an independent body that fixes (determines) the salaries of Snohomish County elected officials ([Chapter 2.105 SCC](#)). Ordinance 07-053 established the current independent form of the commission, repealing a prior commission that provided advisory recommendations on elected salaries. The Commission consists to 10 members. The County Auditor randomly selects six members from among registered voters (one member from each of the five County Council Districts, plus one member at-large) and forwards them to the County Executive. The County Executive nominates the remaining four members with one each from the following sectors: business, professional personnel management, legal profession, and organized labor. Members serve for terms of two years and no person may serve more than two terms. Detailed requirements are in [SCC 2.105.040](#) and [RCW 36.17.024](#).

The nominees: James Caravan would represent District 1. Anna Strom represents District 2. Markus Surratt represents District 3. Nidhi Goyat would represent District 4. Erik Marin would represent District 5. Deborah Hoover would represent voters at-large. Joseph Wankelman would represent the business sector. Megan Hodgson would represent professional personnel management. Cory Rein represents the legal profession. Charlotte Murry represents organized labor.

All nominees are qualified to serve or to continue serving. The County Executive recommends approval of all ten appointments and reappointments.
