The data will be used to track demand for naloxone and distribute it where it is most needed.
□Other		A naloxone leave-behind agreement provides local jurisdictions and tribes with naloxone to leave behind with individuals they encounter.

⊠Approve □Do Not Approve □N/A	Background form agreer	Estimation programs  Snohomish County Council passed Ordinance No. 23-048 <sup>1</sup> approving nents for naloxone distribution (leave-behind program) between Snohomish local jurisdictions within Snohomish County on June 7, 2023.
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RCW 69.41.095<sup>2</sup> establishes that any person or "entity" (e.g., police department, homeless shelter) can obtain, possess, and administer naloxone.

In response to an Executive Directive<sup>3</sup> issued by Executive Dave Somers on May 18, 2023, the Opioid Response Multi-Agency Coordination developed goals including "Reduce negative health outcomes, including death, by expanding available resources for individuals who misuse or abuse drugs," and identifies near-term strategies, including "supply and support naloxone leave-behind program for first responders4."

Requested Action: Move to the GLS agenda on April 17, 2024, for Council to consideration.
