Deb Bell, Sr. Legislative Analyst, provided a detailed staff report.

ACTION: Vice-Chair Nehring made a motion to set time and date for a public hearing for Ordinance 23-109 on November 29, 2023, at the hour of 10:30 a.m. Councilmember Dunn seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Items 6 b. and 6.c., Ordinances 23-111 and 23-112, were discussed together.

Deb Bell, Sr. Legislative Analyst, explained these two ordinances are in addition to the 13 previous ordinances that have been set for public hearing. She said there will be a total of 19 interlocal agreements for solid waste with various cities and towns in Snohomish County. Councilmembers did not request further discussion, at this time.

Ryan Countryman, Sr. Legislative Analyst, provided a staff report and explained the current change order would extends the agreement an additional five years to October 31, 2028. The annual cost of the extension would be \$92,996.00. He said the Airport Fund 410 has sufficient funds for current and future years and there is no impact to County general revenues.
