# AMENDING THE 2019 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN TO ALLOCATE SUPPLEMENTAL COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT CORONAVIRUS FUNDING

WHEREAS, Snohomish County is the representative member of the Snohomish County Urban County Consortium (Consortium) for purposes of application, receipt, and administration of federal grant funds under the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME), and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Program; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Council Motion 19-093, the 2019 Annual Action Plan was approved on May 1, 2019; and

WHEREAS, on March 27, 2020, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act made available \$5 billion in supplemental Community Development Block Grant – Coronavirus (CDBG-CV) funds nationally. The U.S Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) allocated \$4,925,992 to Snohomish County Consortium, consisting of \$1,830,114 in CDBG-CV1 and \$3,095,878 in CDBG-CV3 funds; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Motion 21-151, approved July 28, 2021, Snohomish County Council allocated \$619,176 in CDBG-CV3 for proposed public facilities and infrastructure (PF&I) projects with instructions to publish a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) inviting applicants to apply for CDBG-CV3 funds; and

WHEREAS, on December 3, 2021, a NOFO was published requesting applications for \$619,176 in CDBG-CV3 for PF&I projects. One eligible project was submitted; and

WHEREAS, On March 7, 2022, the Policy Advisory Board (PAB) made a recommendation to the Snohomish County Council to award \$619,176 in CDBG-CV3 funds to Fire District 24 for the Coronavirus Education Prevention Facility; and

WHEREAS, the County has complied with the notification requirements regarding this substantial amendment to the Consortium's Housing and Community Development Policy Advisory Board; and

WHEREAS, the County has complied with the Consortium's citizen participation requirements regarding this substantial amendment; and

WHEREAS, substantial amendments to Annual Action Plans must be approved by the Snohomish County Council;

### **Project Description**

Snohomish County Fire District 24 will use CDBG CV3 funds for costs associated with the design, construction, and purchase costs of a 2600 square foot prefabricated building to be placed on a foundation on Fire District property. The building will be used for classes on prevention, response, and mitigation of COVID-19 and any variant of the virus. The building will additionally serve as an education center andvaccine administration and monitoring facility, as well as an emergency site for the area. The building will be equipped with education tools including a modern projector system, web cameras, and a sound system which would allow the District to provide classes on COVID-19, any variants, and vaccines.
