WHEREAS, Law Enforcement Appreciation Day was founded in 2015 by multiple organizations that joined together to show appreciation for law enforcement professionals in the United States; and

WHEREAS, the County Council acknowledges the dedication, selflessness, and courage of law enforcement professionals in the Snohomish County Sheriff's Office, including more than 400 deputies, command staff, and support personnel; and

WHEREAS, our law enforcement professionals play an integral part in our community and deserve our support; and

WHEREAS, the risks these professionals face in the line of duty are both dangerous and difficult; and

WHEREAS, Snohomish County recognizes the extraordinary service and sacrifice of professionals in law enforcement who keep our communities safe, enforce the rule of law and respond in times of crisis; and

WHEREAS, there are numerous ways to show support for Law Enforcement Appreciation Day, including: wearing blue, sending a card or letter of support to your local police department, sheriff's department, or state agency, and displaying your blue light as part of Project Blue Light; and

WHEREAS, Snohomish County is committed to supporting its law enforcement professionals;


