the solid waste fee schedule will be based on full cost recovery standards and the service fees for solid waste disposal shall be based upon measured weights whenever possible. The Snohomish County Public Works Solid Waste Division has completed the cost-of-service analysis and rate study, which has evaluated current program fees and operational expenses. A step process is being implemented to increase the fees to meet the expense of the programs. An accompanying Ordinance 25-027 is proposed to change County Code to allow for an annual 3% increase to certain fees, update certain fees and add a separate fee for waste export specific services.

In November 2022 the Council approved Motion 22-494 establishing a minimum weight per container for the RRW program and raising the fee on Vactor Waste from \$201 per vactor truck load to \$315 per vactor truck load.

In September 2023 the Council approved Motion 23-390 which revised the operating rules and increased the RRW rate from \$65 per ton to \$85 per ton.

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A new contract for Moderate Risk Waste disposal was signed in January 2024 and the Division has been paying higher disposal costs than what is published on the existing fee schedule. The Solid Waste Division (SWD) completed a Council approved (Motion 24-088) Cost of Service and Rate Analysis, which created a service and rate model to assist with cost forecasting. After reviewing the results of the analysis, it was determined that the adopted tipping fee schedule was no longer adequate to sustain the services.

Due to various reasons, the green waste and clean wood program was suspended and is currently under review. The proposed service fee changes will update the fee schedule for this program so that adequate recovery fees would be in place for if/when it becomes available.
