MOTION NO. 21-457

APPROVING A 2021 BUDGET TRANSFER BETWEEN PROGRAMS IN FUND 130 GRANT CONTROL

WHEREAS, on January 21, 2020, the Washington State Department of Health confirmed the first reported case of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) in the United States in Snohomish County, Washington. COVID-19, a respiratory disease that can result in serious illness or death, is caused by the SARS-CoV-2 virus, which is a new strain of coronavirus that had not been previously identified in humans and can easily spread from person to person; and

WHEREAS, since January 21, 2020, the disease has spread throughout the United States. On January 31, 2020, the United States Department of Health and Human Services secretary Alex Azar declared a public health emergency for COVID-19, beginning January 27, 2020. On February 29, 2020, Washington State Governor Jay Inslee proclaimed a public health emergency for COVID-19. On March 4, 2020, the Snohomish County Health Officer proclaimed a countywide public health emergency for COVID-19. On March 4, 2020, Executive Dave Somers issued a "Local Proclamation of Emergency Snohomish County" for COVID-19 (the "Emergency"). On March 13, 2020, the President of the United States of America declared COVID-19 a National Emergency; and

WHEREAS, throughout March 2020, in order to combat the spread of COVID-19, Governor Jay Inslee increased limitations on public gatherings, encouraged teleworking, closed schools, and ultimately issued the "Stay Home, Stay Healthy" order on March 23, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the "Stay Home, Stay Healthy" required that all people in Washington State immediately cease from leaving their home or place of residence except to participate in essential activities or for employment in essential business activities. The "Stay Home, Stay Healthy" also required all non-essential business operations in Washington State cease operations except for basic minimum operations; and

WHEREAS, during the month of March, 12,301 people within Snohomish County lost their jobs, and job losses are expected to increase substantially in April and May of 2020, demonstrating an economic crisis not seen since the Great Depression; and

WHEREAS, on March 27, 2020, the United States Congress passed the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act of 2020 ("CARES Act"), providing direct relief to units of local government through the United States Department of Treasury; and WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Treasury (Treasury) has issued Coronavirus Relief Fund (CRF) Guidance for State, Territorial, Local, and Tribal Governments for the allowable uses of the direct relief funds. Allowable uses include, but are not limited to, expenses related to facilitating compliance with COVID-19-related public health measures; expenses related to the provision of economic support in connection with the COVID-19 public health emergency, payroll expenses for certain employees whose services are substantially dedicated to mitigating or responding to the COVID-19 public health emergency; and

WHEREAS, on September 2, 2020, Treasury released new guidance that expressly permits the County to presume that work performed by public safety employees is substantially dedicated to addressing the COVID-19 public health emergency and therefore are of a substantially different use than accounted for in the most recently approved budget as of March 27, 2020. All costs of such employees may be covered using payments from the Fund for services provided during the period that begins on March 1, 2020, and ends on December 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, public safety employees would include sheriffs and deputy sheriffs, correctional and detention officers, and those who directly support such employees such as supervisory personnel; and

WHEREAS, the County Council has determined that it is necessary for the support of county government and its existing institutions as well as necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety to appropriate these funds in the speediest manner possible; and

WHEREAS, Snohomish County Council wishes to utilize these funds to pay for the costs associated with its Sheriff's law enforcement services provided in mitigating or responding to the COVID-19 public health emergency; and

WHEREAS, this action will move the expenditure authority to the appropriate line items within Disaster Relief Programs in Fund 130 with no net increase in the total 2021 budget;

NOW, THEREFORE, ON MOTION, the Snohomish County Council takes the following actions pursuant to SCC 4.26.130.
