Proposal: Ord. 22-041 Date: September 20, 2022

Consideration:

The proposed ordinance relates to the residential collection of solid waste and recyclables in unincorporated areas of the county, amending <u>Chapter 7.42</u> of the Snohomish County Code.

Background:

The Residential Collection of Solid Waste and Recyclables in Unincorporated areas of the County was added by Ordinance in 1989, and the code was last revised in 1998. Chapter 7.42 currently contains no language related to the timing or placement of collection containers.

The proposed language would define the timing for setting out collection containers, the appropriate location for collection containers, and the retrieval timing of collection containers. Collection containers for solid waste and recyclables can become a health and public safety issue, as left containers can obstruct roadways, limit traffic flow, emergency vehicle access, obstruct bike lanes, sidewalks, ADA accessibility, road maintenance and can become an attractant to various wildlife (bears, mountain lion, bobcat, opossum, etc.)

Within Snohomish County, eight jurisdictions have language in municipal code related to the timing and/or placement of collection containers.

Current Proposal:

Scope: The proposed code amendments would revise the current language to include the timing of container placement (no sooner than the day prior to collection) and the collection timing of containers (within 12 hours of collection) and would include the placement of containers (no farther than ten feet from the traveled way), so as not to interfere with vehicular pathways, driveways, parking, pedestrian walkways, trails, bicycle lanes and rights-of-way maintenance.

<u>Analysis</u>

Council has the legislative authority to adopt this ordinance amending county code, per SCC 2.48. The existing code section has not been updated since 1998. This is the first code revision for this section, as the Solid Waste Division is currently in the process of updating the Solid Waste Management Plan and is currently waiting direction from the Department of Ecology in regards to the implementation of HB1799.

Request: Move to GLS on September 28, 2022, to consider scheduling a public hearing. Following receipt of public testimony, consider taking action on proposed Ordinance 22-041 or provide other direction to staff.
