Consideration

The Executive's Office requests Council consider approving proposed Motion 22-403 approves and authorizes Amendment 4 to the Evergreen Recovery Center LEAD Contract.

Background

In June 2020, the Council passed Motion 20-212¹ approving a \$1.69 million grant award from the Washington State Health Care Authority (HCA) to implement a Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion (LEAD) program² from June 9, 2020 through June 30, 2021. The county entered into an agreement with Evergreen Recovery Services for LEAD case management services on November 16, 2020, by Motion 20-454 with a not-to-exceed amount of \$600,000.³ Amendment No. 1 extended the term of the agreement through September 30, 2021. Amendment No. 2 extended the term of the agreement through October 31, 2021.

HCA has awarded the Prosecuting Attorney's office an additional grant of \$1,612,064 to continue the LEAD program through June 30, 2023; this resulted in Amendment No. 3 which added \$1,000,000 in funds for the delivery of LEAD services and was approved by Motion 21-398.

Current Proposal

Scope: Motion 22-403 requests Council approval of Amendment No. 4. This amendment adds services related to the Recovery Navigator Program (RNP) to the scope of the agreement, updates the term and increases the total allowable compensation.

Duration: 10/1/2022 through June 30, 2023

Fiscal Implications: Not to exceed \$1,500,000 (Amendment No. 4 adds \$500,000)
