Background Information: The proposed ordinance amends SCC 2.95 related to the duties and composition of the Snohomish Arts Commission by restructuring the Commission to mirror the Fair Advisory Board membership structure (SCC 2.32.079). A summary is as follows:

PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 23-005

RELATING TO THE ARTS COMMISSION DUTIES, AND COMPOSITION; AMENDING CHAPTER 2.95 SNOHOMISH COUNTY CODE

Section 1. Amends SCC 2.95.030 Arts Commission Membership as follows:

The Commission shall be composed of eleven members. Five members to include at least one from each council district. These five members shall represent the council districts, and each shall reside in the district the member represents. Six members shall serve at-large and may reside anywhere within the county, so long as no more than three at-large members reside in the same council district. Appointments and terms shall be pursuant to chapter 2.03 SCC.

This section also amends that commission members shall possess acknowledged accomplishment in various fields, including <u>artisan crafts and goods</u> and heritage <u>and cultural</u> arts.

Section 2. Amends SCC 2.95.040 Duties and Powers of Arts Commission as follows:

The Arts Commission shall advocate for the arts and cultural enrichment of Snohomish County.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT SHEET 1: The Council will also consider Proposed Amendment Sheet 1, which amends SCC 2.95.060 to reflect that a <u>majority</u> of the members of the Commission constitutes a quorum.

At the Public Hearing, the Council may consider additional alternatives/amendments to the proposed ordinance.
