**Subject:** Form Agreements for Stop the Bleed Kit Distribution

**Scope:** Snohomish County has obtained Stop the Bleed Kits for installation at publicly accessible locations throughout the Seattle Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) regions through a memorandum of Understanding with King County. The kits were provided at no cost to Snohomish County.

Ordinance 24-018 approves form agreements with jurisdictions (Exhibit A) and tribes (Exhibit B) to provide Stop the Bleed Kits to recipients in exchange for making them publicly accessible. The recipient will name an employee to serve as a Stop the Bleed trainer for all other staff and volunteers.

**Duration:** From execution and shall expire in five years. The agreement may be extended or renewed to account for FEMA reporting requirements.

**Authority Granted:** Ordinance 24-018 approves and authorizes the County Executive, or a designee, to negotiate agreements for the Stop the Bleed Kit distribution with local jurisdictions and tribes in substantially the same form as those attached to the ordinance as Exhibits A and B.

**Background:** Stop the Bleed encourages bystanders to become trained and equipped to help in a bleeding emergency before professional help arrives. A person can die from blood loss within five minutes, and it is essential to intervene quickly. Those nearest to someone with life threatening injuries are best positioned to provide first care.
