AUTHORIZING THE 2024 HISTORIC PRESERVATION PROGRAM GRANT AWARDS

WHEREAS, Ordinance 08-119 establishes funds to authorize the County to administer a Heritage Preservation program to allocate revenues accruing under provision of RCW 36.22.170; and

WHEREAS, RCW 36.22.170 establishes that one dollar of every document recorded by the county auditor will be designated to the promotion of historic preservation; and

WHEREAS, the County Council created the Historic Preservation Grant Program to provide local assistance in the collection, preservation and interpretation of Snohomish County's heritage; and

WHEREAS, The Snohomish County Historic Preservation Commission established grant criteria and an application process to distribute the funds throughout the heritage community and received applications for program assistance from various heritage preservation organizations in response to a public solicitation for such applications; and

WHEREAS, the Snohomish County Historic Preservation Commission has evaluated the applications for eligibility and recommended funding levels for twelve projects, consistent with provisions of RCW 36.22.170;

NOW, THEREFORE, ON MOTION, the Snohomish County Council approves the 2024 Historic Preservation Grants attached hereto for funding at the recommended levels as set forth therein and authorizes the Director of the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources signature authority to sign the grant agreements on behalf of Snohomish County and any other documents necessary to effectuate all the terms and conditions of said grant agreements.

2024 Historic Preservation Grants Recommendations Summary

Background Summary: By providing matching funds on a competitive basis, the Historic Preservation Program supports projects that promote the public's access to county history. Funding is available for professional development, public education, and capital improvements or collections management. Money is awarded from recording fees collected by the Snohomish County Auditor. The allocation of these fees for projects that "promote historical preservation or historical programs, which may include preservation of historic documents" is authorized under RCW 36.22.170. The revenues accrue to a dedicated fund and may not be used for any purposes other than those stipulated in the RCW.

Summary: The commission met on February 20, 2024, to review 20 grant requests. Commissioners Fred Cruger, Chris Jenkins, Maggie Kase, and Cheri Ryan were present and Commissioner Loren Kraetz submitted his rankings. There were \$181,901 in grant requests submitted for \$75,000 in grant funding. The Snohomish County Historic Preservation Commission recommends grant funding to 12 out of the 20 grant projects reviewed:




