Consideration:

Snohomish County Flood Damage Reduction Grant Program; Awarding the Snohomish County Flood Damage Reduction Grant Program funds; and authorizing the Executive to execute interlocal agreements with grant recipients regarding the expenditure of grant funds.

Background

As part of the Snohomish County's budget process, County Council approved the establishment of a Snohomish County Flood Damage Reduction Grant Program, with a total funding amount of \$200,000. An Ad-Hoc Committee was established to publicize the existence of the program, and to solicit and accept applications requesting grant funds for use in proposed projects to repair flood control facilities.

The Committee met in July of 2020, and discussed the two proposals that were received. Projects include French Slough rehabilitation and enhancement of the lower Pilchuk River Levee downstream of the Pilchuk River trailer park, Sound Equipment, and the old State Route 2 Bridge, and Church Creek dredging as proposed by the Stillaguamish Flood Control District. As carry-over funding was available, the Committee voted to fund the projects at the full 75% county Match, \$75,450 for French Slough and \$60,000 for Church Creek, for a total of \$135,450. Interlocal agreements have been negotiated and agreed to for both projects.

Current Proposal

Adoption of this ordinance approves the recommendation of the Ad-Hoc Committee, and authorizes the County Executive to execute the interlocal agreements with French Slough Flood Control District and with Stillaguamish Flood Control District.
