# How does Parks' work integrate with PDS' Long-Range Planning?


#### **GMA** Requirements

- ★ Review and revise their comprehensive plans and development regulations to ensure the plan and regulations comply with the requirements of the GMA.


• June 30, 2024, deadline to complete the update

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


## **Comprehensive Plan 2024 Update**

- Parks & Recreation Vision Plan (PRVP)
  - Sets our vision and informs our work for the next 6 years
  - Public outreach for the Growth Management Act (GMA)
    Comprehensive Plan (feeds into Parks and Recreation Element)
  - State RCO grant funding requirement
  - o 2020-2021 drafting; 2021 adoption
- Parks & Recreation Element (PRE)
  - Provides the policies, goals, objectives and strategies for providing park services through 2045 and satisfies GMA requirements.
  - o 2022-2023 drafting; 2024 adoption





"Parks bring value (and revenue to local business) and strengthen community. As population grows here, the county needs more spaces to find separation from urban pressures, facilities for organized sports, and a shooting park to direct activity (legitimate and illicit) out of the unincorporated areas plagued today into a facility that will benefit everyone."



*"Wheelchair and walker friendly trails and lookouts seem to be few and hard to get to."* 


*"I would like there to be a yearly pass for county parks that is less than \$75 if not launching a boat. Maybe \$30 like discover pass."*









"Not everyone can afford a flat entry fee - I think a suggested donation would be helpful because then everyone can still use the park/facility and the ones who can afford it can donate."


"Entry fees might restrict those who most need the open space and would be another case of economic/social injustice."

"You could have opportunities for the community to help with fundraisers for their local parks. I have lived in Snohomish for 3 years and didn't know about 95% of the parks that were listed in this survey. Perhaps the popular parks would be less crowded if people knew more about the other parks that are available."




## **Policy Question**

  - Coordination with PDS






## **Climate Change & Parks**

#### • Use existing tools

- Public Works' climate change adaptation decision support tool
- ClimateParkChange.net (National Recreation and Parks Association): "Mitigation and adaptation strategies to build environmental and community resiliency through the power of local parks and recreation"

#### • Working interdepartmentally and across DCNR


- Office of Energy & Sustainability's Climate Action Planning
- SWM & PDS on balancing open space for conservation, ecosystem services, and public access for recreation
- Office of Agriculture to steward regenerative farming on park properties



## **Equity & Parks**



- Use Existing Tools
  - Trust for Public Lands ParkScore Index
  - Learn from other jurisdictions doing this work – Lynnwood, Olympia, Seattle
- Work with Office of Social Justice
  - Consider mapping integrated into other relevant County-wide mapping (human services, public works, parks system)
- Future Tool?
  - Help shape acquisitions and development priority areas
  - Mapping demographics and services, then rank based on highest need to serve historically marginalized communities
