Vice-Chair Nehring provided opening remarks and said he would appreciate Council consideration. Councilmember Low said he is comfortable signing.

Councilmember Peterson spoke to the letter. He said he is appreciative of the letter and not necessarily opposed, but not what he would focus on. He said he is not comfortable signing.

Councilmember Dunn stated she felt similar to Councilmember Peterson and said she won't be signing as it doesn't reflect what she would support.

Chair Mead said he is supportive.

As directed, Ms. Beazizo said she will work with the clerks to have the letter executed by the three supportive members.

Chair Mead provided an introduction and invited guests to the table. Lisa, Case Manager for Sound Pathways and Jason Cockburn, Vice-President and Founder of Second Chance Foundation and Owner and Operator of Day Center/Recover Center, introduced themselves. Councilmember Dunn said she felt it is important to invite guests to hear other perspectives in the struggle to what is being dealt with on the street level for social and drug issues. Important to hear their thoughts on what they think the County can do to help.

Lisa spoke about the work she does to help addicts, helping them quash warrants, housing, treatment, and other services. She responded to various questions from councilmembers and discussion ensued.

Councilmember Dunn asked about services for youth. Lisa responded and stated that she does not work with youth, but the resource she is aware of is the Cocoon House.

Mr. Cockburn spoke to youth services, youth drug use, and fentanyl. Mr. Cockburn continued and shared some of his personal experiences. He spoke to current issues and how they relate the proposed ordinance.
